Croft Cottage, Ardara



Croft Cottage is situated on the north shore of Loughros Point overlooking Loughros More Bay and Innishbarnog Island four miles due west of Ardara, part of a small clachan and on a cul-de-sac running north from the main road. This traditional 2 bedroom cottage has been sympathetically restored, with an emphasis on providing bright welcoming, warm accommodation. The central living room is bright and comfortable with views north to Tramore beach. It has TV and wood burning cast iron stove, bookcase, table and comfortable seating.

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Ardara, or Ard an Ratha in Gaelic, which means Fort on the hill is situated 27 km north of Donegal Town and is nestled in panoramic beauty by the sea shore within an arrangement of hills which keep a watchful eye on this dainty little touristic village. From this pinnacle (the Fort) one can look



down the descending hill which winds its way down the Front Street, passing many well known establishments like Bonner's Knitwear Shop, Kennedy of Ardara, Campbells and **Nancy's pub**. In the centre of the town is the diamond roundabout, the crossroads for many a traveller,



where routes to Donegal town, Glenties and Killybegs can be taken. Wandering over the main street there is many a watering hole, including the **Corner House** (Peter Oliver's) where traditional Irish music is played nightly. Further on is the **Nesbitt Arms Hotel** and then Brennan's Bar and the Central Bar all with their own very original and heart warming style. Ardara has three churches, the catholic church is located at the westend of the town. The Church of Ireland and Methodist Churches are situated on the Hillhead.



The nearby **Owenea River** is famous for its salmon. Some of the main scenic points near the

town are the Glengesh Pass, the **Maghera Falls** and the views



out over the Atlantic from **Loughros Point**.



Ardara Heritage Centre tells the story of Donegal tweed

from the shearing of sheep to the manufacture of the woven cloth. Old photographs, displays and models recall the history of tweed production in the Ardara region. Weavers at work show how a loom operates and the different stitches which make up Aran knitwear can be examined
