

(d) All non-inert waste shall be segregated where possible and removed from the site on an ongoing basis by a waste collector with a valid **waste collection permit** from the National Waste Collection Permit Office.

(e) Only clean waste soils are permitted to be sent to facilities with a waste facility permit for land reclamation or raising of land. Waste brick, block and concrete may only be accepted at the facility to provide for haul roads or hardstanding areas.

(f) Contaminated soil or soil with non-inert waste mixed through is acceptable only at a landfill licensed by the Environmental Protection Agency and will be subject to landfill levy.

Reason: In the interests of public health, to avoid pollution and to ensure proper development.

22. The applicant/developer to pay to Kildare County Council the sum of **€5,592.86** being the appropriate contribution to be applied to this development in accordance with the Development Contribution Scheme adopted by Kildare County Council on 5th November 2015 in accordance with Section 48 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended. Payments of contributions are strictly in accordance with Section 13 of Development Contribution Scheme adopted by Kildare County Council on 5th November 2015.

Note: Please note water and wastewater development contribution charges now form part of the water connection agreement, if applicable, with Irish Water.

Reason: It is considered reasonable that the developer should make a contribution in respect of public infrastructure and facilities benefiting development in the area of the Planning Authority.
