In the late 17th century Stephen Moore purchased the Kilworth Estate in County Cork, his later descendants including the Earl of Mountcashell were credited with the building of Moorepark House, its entrances & Lodge. Today the Lodge continues to stand proudly at the superb dressed limestone northern entrance to the Moorepark Estate and the now late Moorepark House. The Lodge is a miraculous survivor of a time predating the foundation of the State.

The Property retains many of its original features & has been diligently & carefully maintained & refinished throughout by its sympathetic owners. Offering tremendous character, it is an unrivalled and private c.0.17 of an acre village site benefitting from numerous outbuildings (one suitable for conversion to office/studio space) & Kilworths wealth of amenities within walking distance. Junction 14 of the M8 motorway is a 3-minute drive with the Jack Lynch Tunnel just 25minutes.

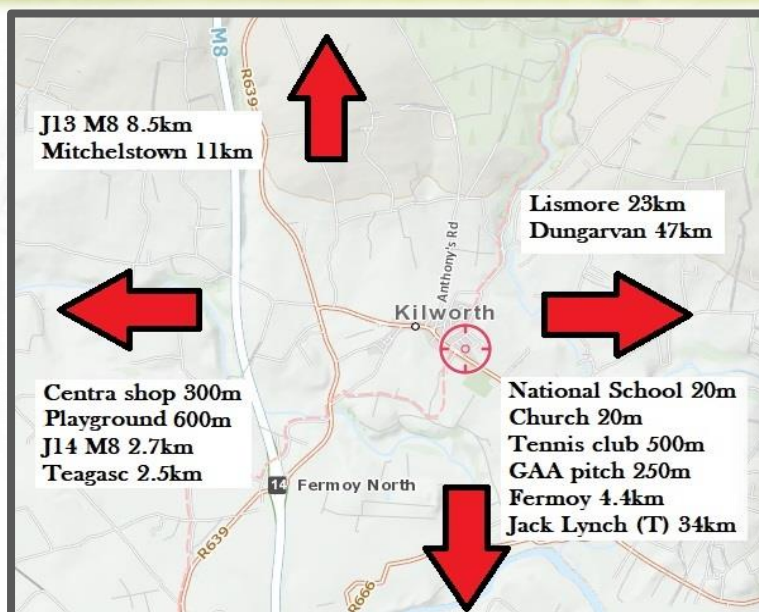

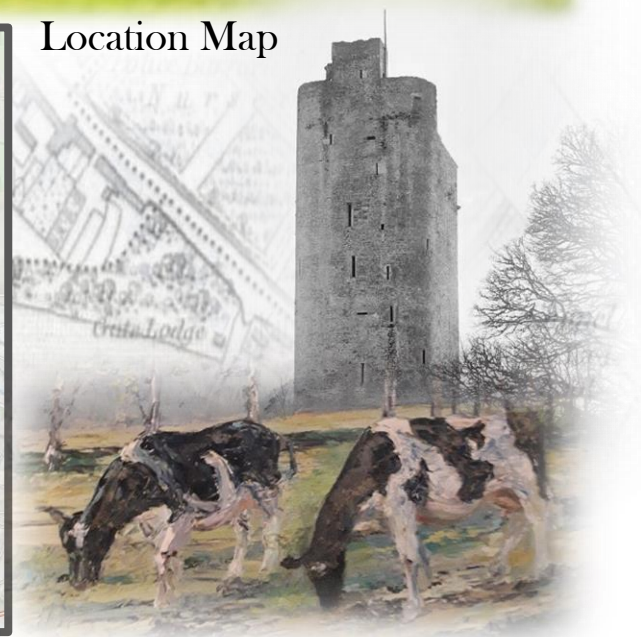
Location:



Located in the heart of Kilworth Village, A short drive from the amenities of Fermoy & Mitchelstown. Cork & Limerick are all within commuting distance. The M8 Motorway is easily accessed at Junctions 14 (3 minutes), with the property just 25minutes from the Jack Lynch Tunnel. Despite such convenience the property benefits greatly from a picturesque community location with the most superb countryside views over Moorepark & Cloghleigh Castle. Fishing, hill walking & equestrian activities are all prominent close-by.



Location Map

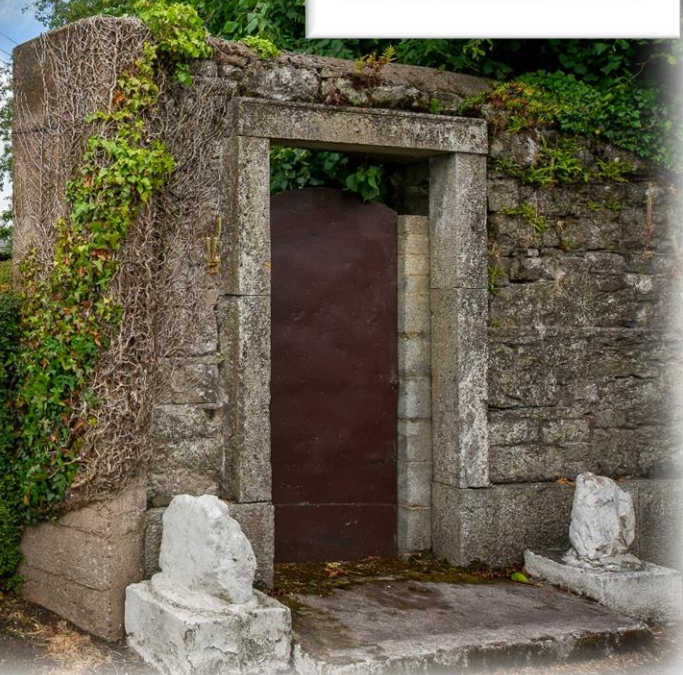


Features:

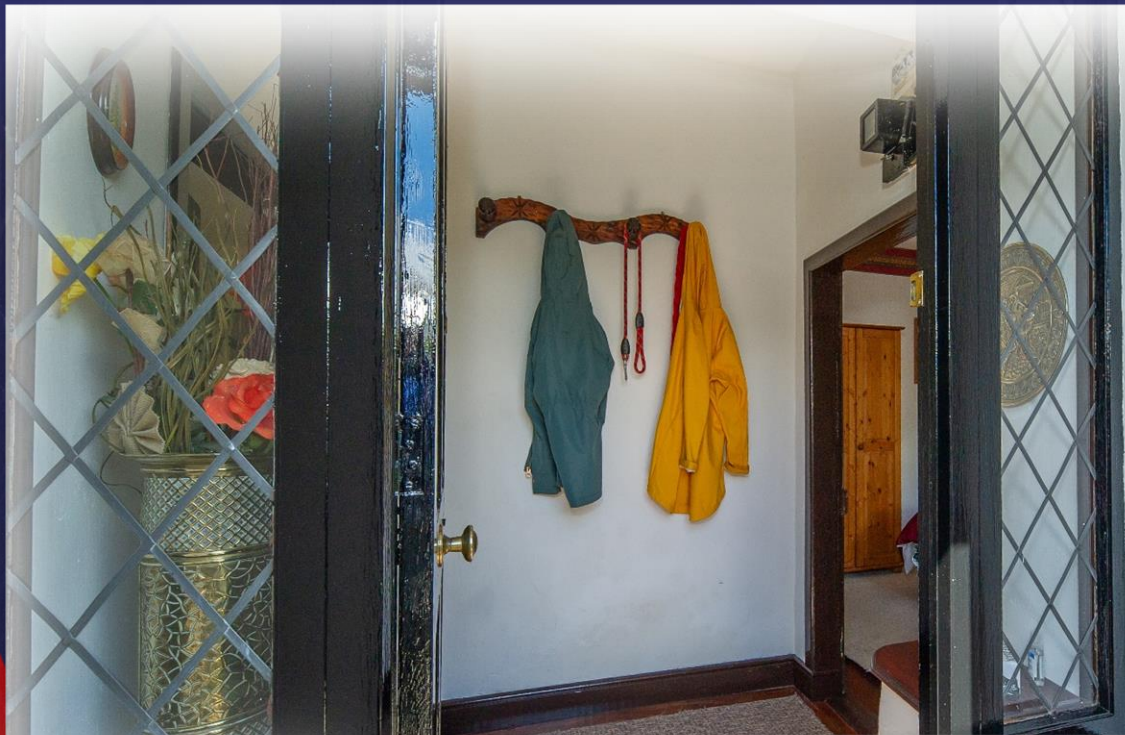
Constructed in the 1820s to service the Moorpark Estate & the late Moorpark House. This significant Estate is described in a number of historical documents, and features in the intriguing tale of "The Enchanted Horse of Cloghleagh Castle" by O'Flanagan. The property has been lovingly, sympathetically refinished and maintained by its current owners.

The property contains a wealth of character and original features, High ceilings (c.9ft), lime plastered walls, original doors & joinery with hand painted detail, Bakelite light switch, arched window detailing, wooden beams, blown glass shades, stucco quoins, cobble pathways and a landmark dressed limestone pedestrian entrance and wrought iron railing.

- 3 minutes from junction 14 of the M8.
- 25 minutes from the Jack Lynch Tunnel.
- Solid fuel stove. Gas water heating.
- Mains water & septic tank.

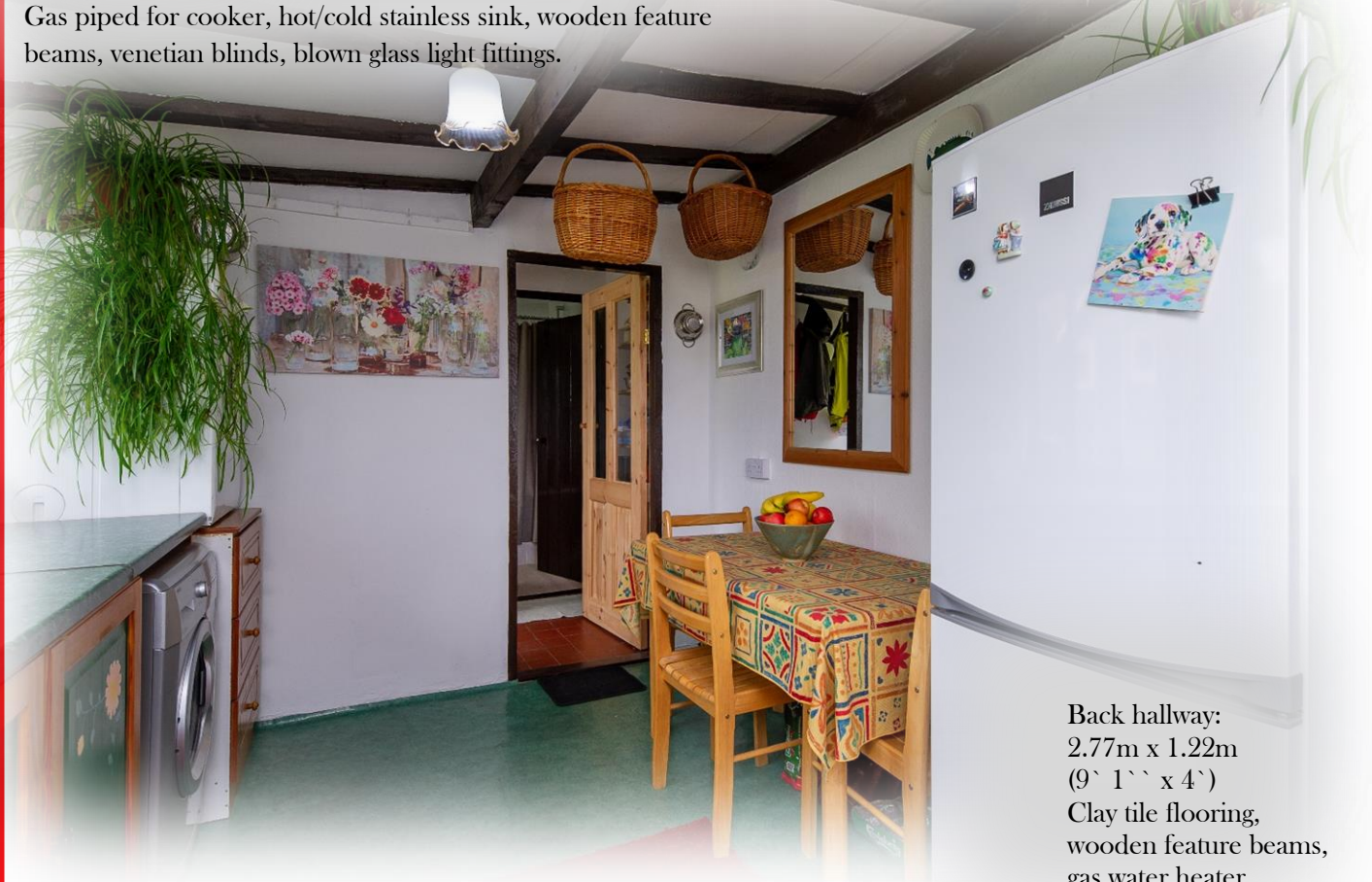

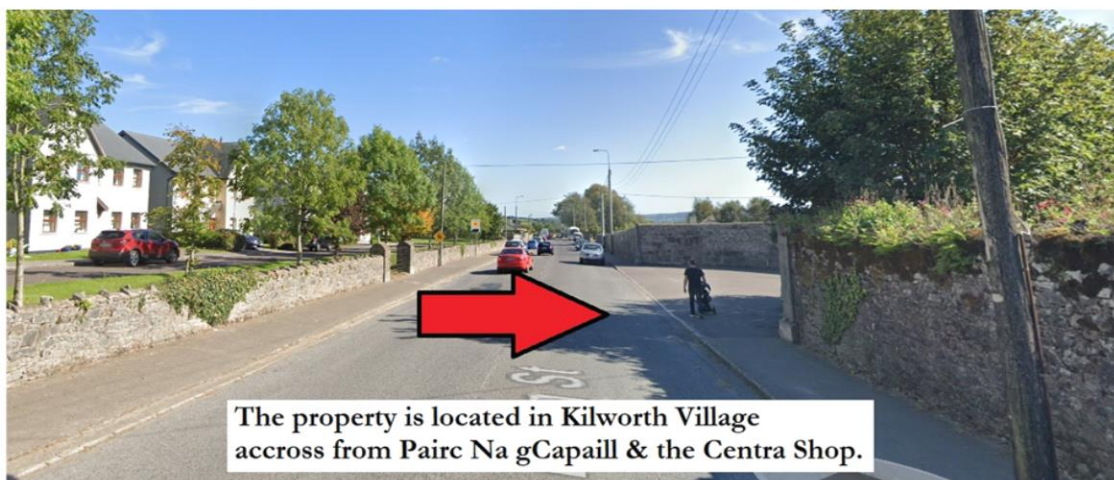
The property benefits from a superb village centre c.0.17 an acre “Dressed Limestone” walled garden containing:

Quadrant rubble stone entrance gateway, built c. 1820. Curving walls have dressed and tooled limestone plinth course and dressed limestone terminating piers. Square-headed pedestrian entrances flanking entrance, with dressed limestone surrounds and lintels, that to south-east having decorative cast-iron gate. Dressed limestone piers to vehicular entrance. Three-bay single-storey gate lodge to south-west with projecting central entrance bay. Hipped slate roof with rendered chimneystack, overhanging eaves and render eaves course. Painted rendered walls with render quoins. Square-headed openings with replacement fixed timber windows and concrete sills, those to south-east elevation having pointed arch recessed surrounds. Pointed arch opening to doorway with timber battened half-door and recessed replacement timber door.

Appraisal

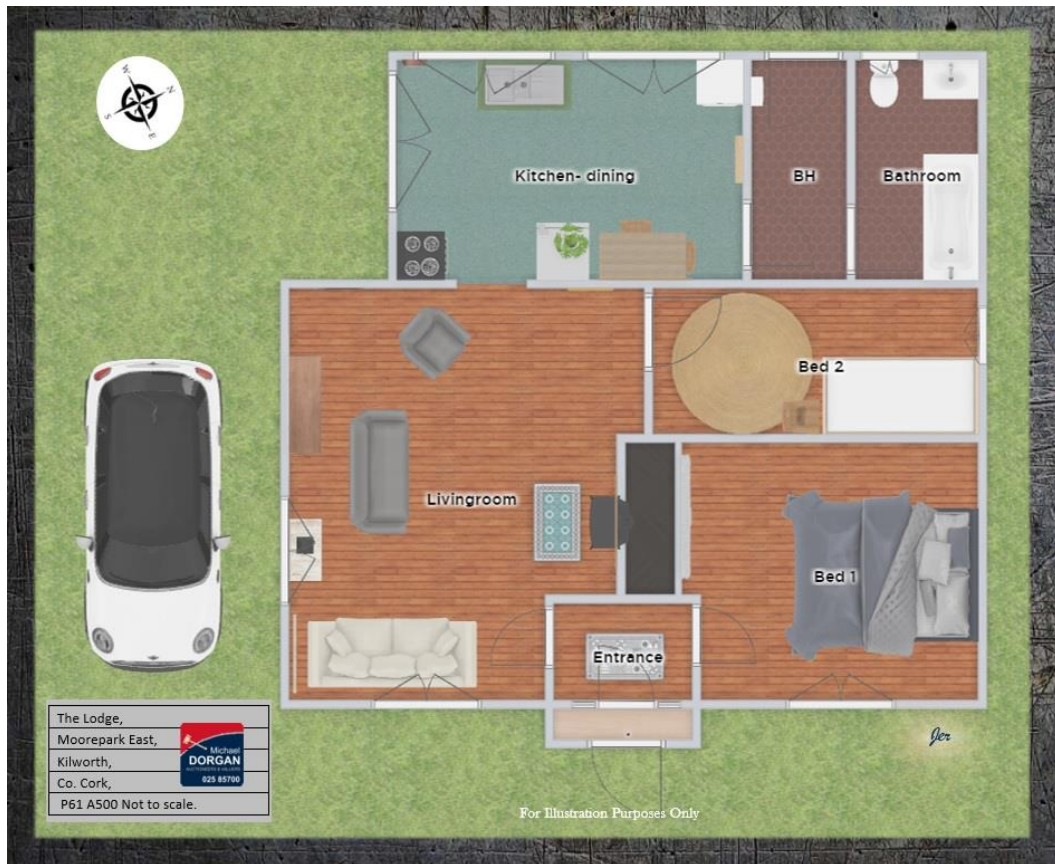
This site was once the entrance to the Moore Park estate, which was the big house around which Kilworth grew. Its curved walls are a notable feature on the roadside and are accentuated by the finely crafted limestone piers and plinth course. The form of the entrance, with the main opening flanked by pedestrian entrances is of an elegant design, befitting the site and its historical importance within the town. The gate lodge retains much of its original form and is characteristic of gate lodges of its time.
