Dungloe is a charming town on the northwest coast of County Donegal, along Ireland's Wild Atlantic Way.

It is the largest town in the beautiful Gaeltacht region known as the Rosses, where Irish is spoken daily. Dungloe is ideally located just 13km from Donegal Airport (voted most scenic airport in the world) providing direct flights to Dublin and further afield.

Dungloe is a gateway for unforgettable island-hopping adventures. Just offshore, Arranmore Island awaits—a rugged, windswept Gaeltacht island of stunning

natural beauty, with walking trails, hidden beaches, and a lively cultural scene. Closer still, Cruit Island is linked to the mainland by a small bridge and offers golden beaches, a spectacular 9-hole golf course, and peaceful coastal walks perfect for a daytrip. From Magheragallon Pier, you can reach Gola Island, a serene haven steeped in music, tradition, and wild beauty, while further out, the legendary Tory Island enchants with dramatic sea cliffs, rare birdlife, rich mythology, and a timeless atmosphere that feels like stepping back in time.

Connectivity

County Donegal's connectivity has significantly improved in recent years with major investments in roads, greenways and public transport to better link the region.

The N56 road connects Dungloe to Ireland's Wild Atlantic Way and to Letterkenny, Donegal's largest town, with a population of 23,000 people. Donegal Airport is located in Carrickfinn only 13km from Dungloe and operates direct flights to Dublin and Glasgow. Voted the 'Most Scenic Airport in the World' due to the breathtaking approach over the Wild Atlantic Way, with views of Mount Errigal, golden beaches, and the rugged Donegal coastline.

























Inis Fitness

Donegal Tourism

County Donegal, located on Ireland's northwest coast, is known for its rugged coastline, mountains, sea cliffs, and Gaeltacht (Irish-speaking) communities.

According to Failte Ireland, Donegal attracted 700k domestic tourists and 180k overseas tourists in 2023 and tourism generated over c. €340m in revenue for the county's economy (Donegal Key Tourism Facts 2023).

Visitors choose Donegal for its breathtaking beaches and islands, dramatic mountain ranges, and diverse wildlife. Outdoor enthusiasts can windsurf at Magheroarty, one of the finest windsurfing locations in Ireland, hike through the Derryveagh Mountains, or take on the challenge of climbing Mount Errigal and Muckish. Golfers are spoiled for choice with spectacular courses at Narin & Portnoo Links, Cruit Island Links, and Gweedore Golf Club, each offering stunning coastal views. For families, attractions such as Glenveagh National Park, the charming Fintown Railway, and the fun-filled Errigal View Pet Zoo ensure that there is something for every generation to enjoy.

Mary From Dungloe International Arts Festival

Since 1967, the Mary From Dungloe International Arts Festival has been at the heart of summer in Donegal, transforming Dungloe into a vibrant hub of music, culture, and celebration. This ten-day festival showcases Irish music, dance, language, and the arts. At its centre is the crowning of the Mary From Dungloe, where Irish communities from across the world, along with towns and counties throughout Ireland, nominate a young woman to represent their area. The winner holds the honour of the title for a year, becoming a proud ambassador for the festival, for Dungloe, and for Donegal.

Ireland Market Highlights



Strong Economy

Ireland's economy benefits from strong exports, foreign direct investment, and a robust technology sector. This is bolstered by a well-educated, English-speaking workforce and membership in the European Single Market, making it an attractive destination for multinational corporations. Ireland has a strong economic outlook with the Central Bank of Ireland predicting GDP growth of 9.7% in 2025 and and 2.7% in 2026 (as of July 2025), supported by increased global trade, falling inflation and a strong labour market. Ireland's economy has been ranked 4th most competitive globally by the International Institute for Management Development. The ranking reflects Ireland's strengths in areas like business efficiency and international trade openness.



Growing Population

Ireland has a population of 5.3m people, an 11.3% increase since 2016. Donegal has a county population of approx. 170k people. Ireland has one of youngest populations in Europe with 59% of people aged under 45 (CSO).



Attractive Tax Regime

Ireland has a low corporate tax rate of 12.5%, making it very attractive for multinational corporations and a minimum corporate tax rate of 15% for multinationals with annual revenues exceeding €750m.



Low Unemployment Rate

Ireland has a near effective zero unemployment with a rate of 4.3% as at May 2025. There are c. 2.7m people employed in Ireland, of which 68k are employed in Co. Donegal.



Leading European Destination

In 2024, Ireland saw 6.6m overseas visitors, spending over €6bn in the Irish economy (CSO). According to Failte Ireland, tourism was worth over €255m to the local economy in Donegal in 2024.
